RANCH CLEANUP 2011

Your Homeowner's Association is again hosting the annual cleanup event over the three-day period of 10-12 June.

Sponsored by the Red Rock Ranch HOA Board of Directors, we will provide dumpsters for every-one's convenience. Board members and others will be available from 8:00 AM until 4:00 PM each day to help users load up the trash/treasures. Come for a dump or just a visit and bring your coffee.

Resident response has been great in the past and we encourage everyone to use this opportunity to spruce up his or her property. Lets keep the Ranch looking spiffy for another year.

We accept non-volatile debris, building materials, carpeting, small appliances and the like. We cannot take paint, gasoline and other flammables or dangerous chemicals. In addition, we will not accept any items that incur a fee for disposal. These items include computers, hard drives, televisions and other electronic gear.



We will not be doing the mulching operation this year due to lack of demand last year. Limited room will exist in the dumpsters for small quantities of brush, slash, limbs, etc. Please cut them up first.

So, come on down to the tennis court, meet your friends and drop off your trash. We'll see you there.

BURGLARY ON THE RANCH

A ranch homeowner experienced a break-in and burglary recently. The event was on the upper ranch near Red Rocks Drive and Sandstone Rd. The homeowner notified authorities, but there has been no further report to date.

The homeowner also notified the HOA and we posted the details on our website. That posting was helpful and drew some information from others regarding potential suspects. Also, others were cautioned to be alert for strangers and roving passers by.

MORE INFO: GOT WASTE THE DUMPSTERS CAN'T TAKE?

The El Paso County government has several programs that may be able to handle the items you want to get rid of but cannot put in the dumpster for environmental reasons. They also publish a helpful recycling directory. Currently the online path to this information is at "http://adm.elpasoco.com/ Environmental Division/Recycling Information", or go to www.elpasoco.com and search for "recycling". The hazardous waste collection is a little bit of a drive away on Akers (near Powers) but the slash and mulch program is much closer, just south of Shoup road.

The directory includes information about paint, chemicals, batteries, cell phones, construction materials, fluorescent lamps, Freon, phone books, mattresses, medical waste, metals, Styrofoam and more.

Consider saving landfill space and taking your items to one of the businesses or organizations in the directory. Some places may charge for your items, so call first. Some businesses have agreements with certain manufacturers to waive the fees for their brands (TVs especially).

TRASH ON THE RANCH -JIM BERGERON

With heavy winds that seem to constantly blow throughout Red Rock Ranch, unwanted trash is a constant problem, especially when it ends up on our prop-



erty- usually high enough in the scrub oak where we have to remove it using a step ladder or long handled rake. Much of the problem can be eliminated if we just follow one simple step, and that is using trash containers with securely fitting lids, sometimes held in place with bungee straps. Now that certainly will not deter bears when they come out of hibernation, but it does deter crows and magpies with strong beaks that can tear into the toughest plastic, as well as gusts of wind.

Trash containers with lids can be purchased at Wal-Mart or Home Depot at reasonable prices, or your pickup service will provide them at a nominal fee. Let's be considerate of our neighbors and make the Ranch a trash-free place to live.
